FEEDING 5000

Believe in Hull, a Christian organisation that brings the Hull churches together in Hull recently put out a strange request for knitted fish! In fact they wanted 5000 knitted fish to give out at an event held in June which would aim to feed 5000 people, in one day, in the city centre. This seemed like an impossible task to me, but they did hit their target. Above is a picture of some of the fish that our knit and natter group knitted towards that 5000.

This got me thinking about the time when Jesus feed 5000 people in a desolate place with only five loaves and two fish, a true miracle. This was the 'pack-up' of a little boy, the staple diet for a short journey into the hills. The loaves were small cakes sufficient for one person's afternoon meal and the fish would have been very small and dried or pickled. Looking up to heaven Jesus said a blessing over the bread and fish and the meal was miraculously provided by God. Those five tiny loaves and two little fish feed not only the 5000 men present that day but also the women and children present as well. The total number of people feed may have included 10,000 or more. With 12 baskets of food left over! How amazing is that.

Our God is still a God of miracles today. He supplies for the needs of His people. Jesus set an example for us all when He looked into heaven and asked God to bless that food – a fitting practise for all who trust the Father for the daily provision of their needs. Doreen

Jesus Feeds the Five Thousand

13 When Jesus heard what had happened, he withdrew by boat privately to a solitary place. Hearing of this, the crowds followed him on foot from the towns. 14 When Jesus landed and saw a large crowd, he had compassion on them and healed their sick.

15 As evening approached, the disciples came to him and said, “This is a remote place, and it’s already getting late. Send the crowds away, so they can go to the villages and buy themselves some food.”

16 Jesus replied, “They do not need to go away. You give them something to eat.”

17 “We have here only five loaves of bread and two fish,” they answered.

18 “Bring them here to me,” he said.

19 And he directed the people to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke the loaves. Then he gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the people.

20 They all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over.

21 The number of those who ate was about five thousand men, besides women and children.
